## Open with the Serenity Prayer

Crystal Meth Anonymous is a fellowship of people who share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others to recover from addiction to crystal meth and all other mind-altering substances.

- -- The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop using.
- -- There are no dues or fees for CMA membership; we are self-supporting through our own contributions.
- -- CMA is not allied with any sect, denomination, politics, organization or institution; does not wish to engage in any controversy; neither endorses nor opposes any causes.
- -- Our primary purpose is to live free of active addiction and to carry that message to the addict that still suffers.

This is an open meeting of Crystal Meth Anonymous. Anyone interested in our program is welcome to attend this meeting. CMA is a fellowship which makes use of A.A., N.A., and CMA printed materials and books for our step work. The purpose of this meeting is to study the basic text of Alcoholics Anonymous. We will discuss the contents of the Big Book as it relates to the illness of addiction and it's recovery through the twelve-step program as outlined in the book. It should be noted that addiction is referred to as alcoholism in this text. This is a meeting about solutions. We ask that we focus our discussion around our understanding and experience with the literature and steps.

pointing out any prayer, promise or warning.

3. Discussion will follow on the selected reading until 8:45PM. In an effort to allow as many

people to share as possible we would like a volunteer to be the spiritual timekeeper. (Select a volunteer). Please provide a one-minute warning after 3 minutes of sharing.
